## **New Welcome Chairs**

We took receipt of our new chairs last week, which has made a huge improvement to the space in the Welcome, especially the practicality. The previous chairs were donated from a church which was closing and were intended as a temporary measure. They were very bulky and heavy making them difficult to move around, as well as taking up too much space. This is a multi-functional space and is constantly being rearranged.

The new chairs have been part funded by a Circuit grant and are far more practical, offering the following benefits:

- Light and stackable
- Easily maneuvered for large meetings and small committee meetings, by anyone.
- Easier to clear the space completely eg. Jumble Sale/Model Railway.
- Easy to reconfigure during the Cafe sessions, with different numbers at different tables. The previous chairs were very bulky which did not allow this.
- Better access as a thoroughfare to the church, either from the hall or from outside.

Trussell launches The Hardship Times Over 1.4 million emergency food parcels were provided by food banks in the Trussell UK community in just 6 months. On Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> November, food banks, anti-poverty charities and people with lived experience of hardship, alongside key Ambassadors, gathered at Parliament Square to unveil a bold new newspaper, The Hardship Times.
