

Members of the team at Wellfest – Hartpury Sep 2024

14<sup>th</sup> Sept A homeless man had lost all of his possessions and so the team sign posted him to contact City Mission on Monday.

21<sup>st</sup> Sept Our team supported the police with a possible rape victim whilst she gave her statement and we then escorted her to the taxi.

5<sup>th</sup> Oct A couple were arguing, a homeless man tried to intervene but was then knocked out. We called the police and a medic and the aggressor was arrested.

**26**<sup>th</sup> **Oct** Susan\* was stranded in Gloucester and was helped to find access to details for her transport to Northants.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Nov** Our team helped Lisa\* and Karen\*. Lisa had been helping Karen home as she was very drunk, but in doing so fell and hit her head. The street medics took Lisa to hospital and the team stayed with Karen for over an hour until she was sober enough to get help her a taxi home.

9th Nov Tom\* was helped up from the floor, given some water and given help to start his walk home.

**16<sup>th</sup> Nov** The team came across a very drunk man who was sat down in a corner and soporific. Our team looked after him for about 1 hour until he was well enough to take a taxi to his hotel.

**30**<sup>th</sup> **Nov** Simon, a young drunk lad was sat outside a shop. He was offered water and after an initial reluctance to talk, after a while quickly engaged chatting with the team. (\*Not their real name)
